2 Corinthians 5:11-6:2. 'What is the Cross for?' The coronavirus is a global pandemic we hope won't stay around; but human sin is a far more deadly infection permanently with us. The only remedy for the sin epidemic is the cross of Christ. Paul gives three angles on the cross, each with its own challenge: (1) It is a sacrifice ('Christ died for all'). In his love Jesus laid down his life for us all, so how can we go back to our old life of caring only for ourselves? When plagues struck ancient Rome, the Christians were known for tending not only their own sick but also pagan neighbours. (2) It achieves reconciliation ('God was in Christ reconciling the world to himself, not counting their sins against them'). We become friends of God rather than his enemies, with all charges dropped. Our task therefore is to be Christ's ambassadors; all of us are his representatives, showing the fruit of the Spirit, and seizing chances to explain our faith. (3) It offers justification, putting us right with God ('God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God'). This 'rightness of God' works all through our lives. So are we receiving God's grace in vain? Are we like the Dead Sea (which has inflow but no outflow) or the Sea of Galilee (which has the fresh Jordan river flowing through it)?
